Message from WHI President

As we near the end of 2024, we would like to share an update on WHI's collaborative efforts with AO Neemia (Neemia) in Moldova throughout the year. Neemia has continued its regular community center programs, which include hot lunches for the elderly, an afterschool program, various clubs, and summer camps. We're especially pleased that they've expanded their services to another county. This summer, they organized a camp for children from four small villages in Riscani County. They are now discussing with local mayors ways to extend support to the elderly and individuals with special needs, broadening their reach to a total of nine villages.

Another highlight is the community engagement initiative that Neemia began last year with the creation of a sports area, which continued in 2024 with the construction of a walking bridge in Cobani. Neemia partnered with the mayor's office to engage the community, mobilizing residents to contribute funds and volunteer their labor. The community responded enthusiastically, offering both monetary support and hands-on help to complete the bridge. We are encouraged by the community's positive response over the past two years and hope to see this spirit of engagement continue.

In July, I traveled to Moldova and had the chance to participate in some of Neemia's activities. During my visit, I also met Adam, a new Peace Corps volunteer who will be working with Neemia in Cobani for the next two years. We discussed his role and how it aligns with WHI's objectives.

Thank you for your continued support in improving lives in Moldova. We look forward to your support in 2025 to help us make an even greater impact.

Building a Brighter Future: AO Neemia's Transformative Impact on Cobani

Before returning to my village and running for mayor in 2023, I associated Neemia with genuine "care and love for people, especially the elderly." I knew of their initiatives, such as the social kitchen, children's camps, and various community development projects. However, once I was elected as mayor of Cobani in November 2023, I gained a deeper appreciation of Neemia's dedicated and far-reaching impact on our community. Working closely with Neemia, I witnessed firsthand how civic engagement can inspire residents to actively participate in volunteer efforts that enrich our village as a whole.

Since November 2023, our collaboration has reached significant milestones. Together, we completed a children's playground and a multifunctional sports area with financial support from Wings of Hope International, People In Need, the local administration, and the generous time and donations of local citizens. Over time, my partnership with Neemia has only grown stronger. A recent example of our

collaboration was a community-led project to construct a walking bridge connecting Cobani to Vatra Horelor— Cobani's "visiting card" for tourists. Completed just in time for our 650th Village Day celebration, this project exemplifies Neemia's commitment, which extends far beyond physical infrastructure. With Neemia's guidance, local youth are increasingly involved in initiatives like holiday preparations, maintaining village cleanliness, and distributing food packages.

Neemia has truly become a cornerstone of our community. The organization plays a vital role in projects like delivering food packages to the elderly on International Day of the Elderly, which brought joy to many faces. Our shared goal is to transform Cobani—to develop infrastructure, create jobs, and promote rural tourism so that people worldwide can come to know our village and its warmth. We strive to ensure that residents enjoy a higher quality of life and that every visitor feels

at HOME in Cobani. I am proud that our work is grounded in shared values: •Love and care for people, especially the most vulnerable.

- •Fostering a spirit of volunteerism among all residents.

Integration in Cobani

As a Peace Corps volunteer, the first three months in our communities are considered an "integration period," during which we learn about Moldova, our communities, and the work of our counterpart organizations. In my opinion, Neemia is one of the best organizations for a volunteer to be part of to ensure a smooth and enriching integration process. I say this because Neemia is dedicated to improving the quality of life for individuals at every stage of life, so my first three months have given me a complete picture of Cobani and a deep appreciation for the diverse needs and strengths of its people.

Three days a week, I help deliver hot meals directly to elderly individuals and people with disabilities. It's a privilege connect with people rich in life experience and wisdom to while helping to meet their needs. Not only does this improve my Romanian, but I also receive history lessons through firsthand accounts and invaluable advice on navigating hardship. Many of our beneficiaries have invited me over for coffee in my free time, and I've never hesitated to embrace these wonderful opportunities. Five days a week, I'm greeted by the cheerful faces of the children in our afterschool program, led by our wonderful teacher, Ms. Angela. On Fridays, I contribute to this fun and educational program by giving an interactive English lesson to 9-10 year olds, and do (continued on the next column)
